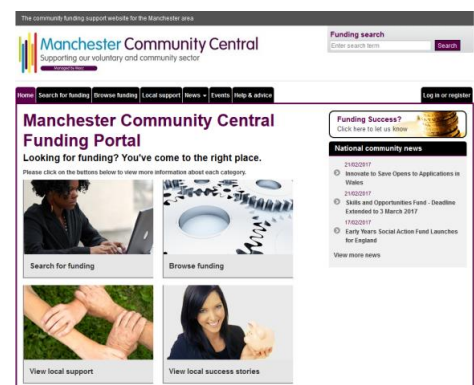

By becoming a member of Macc you will gain access to our free funding portal of funding opportunities. Please note: To be eligible to access our



funding portal you must be a VCSE organisation working in the City of Manchester with at least 50% of your beneficiaries in the City of Manchester. VCSE organisations working outside of the City of Manchester, consultants, sole traders, statutory bodies, private businesses and infrastructure organisations who become members of Macc aren't eligible to access our funding portal. <b>Aims/priorities:</b>	<p>Financial support in the form of grants is available to registered charities, CIC's and voluntary organisations. The Charity Service are keen to support organisations that are working 'on the ground' directly supporting disadvantaged people within the Greater Manchester area. Grant funds are available for:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• the purchase or supply of activities, amenities or equipment that will improve the general welfare of the local community or an individual</li> <li>• the purchase or supply of activities, amenities or items of a medical nature NOT supplied by the NHS</li> <li>• new project costs (for a specific period)</li> <li>• any other charitable purpose that has a direct impact on the welfare of the local community or an individual</li> <li>• holidays or days out to visit an attraction for children who are disadvantaged, disabled, sick and/or convalescent whose family are unable to afford the cost (referral must be via a supporting agency)</li> </ul>	


<b>Who can apply?</b>	Registered charities, CIC's and voluntary organisations
<b>Grant amount:</b>	Grants applications for funding will be assessed on the proposed impact, outcomes and budgetary detail. <b>Theatre Improvement Scheme</b> 	
<b>Aims/priorities:</b>	Grants are available for not-for-profit theatres in the UK for capital improvement projects that will improve environmental sustainability. Grants can be used for capital costs of building or equipment. The theme for applications is Improving Environmental Sustainability. Funding will be given to projects that demonstrate how a small intervention can have a big impact on reducing the theatre's environmental impact.
<b>Who can apply?</b>	<p>To be eligible, applicants must meet the following requirements:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Own or manage theatres with titles or signed leases of more than five years on buildings in England, Scotland, Wales or Northern Ireland</li> <li>• Demonstrate that they run a year-round programme of live performance, of no less than 30 performances a year</li> <li>• Have a bona fide UK charitable or not-for-profit legal structure and be able to provide certified or audited accounts for at least two years</li> <li>• Operate theatres that achieve excellence through their producing and programming or architectural significance</li> </ul>
