Breaking Barriers offers bespoke employment and education support to enable people from a refugee background to acquire the knowledge, confidence, and experience they need to secure stable and fulfilling employment. To achieve this, we offer different types of support:

#### One-to-one employment support

All Breaking Barriers clients are assigned a dedicated Employment and Integration Adviser, who will offer one-to-one, personalised support to guide them through their journey into training, education and/or employment. They will receive support with the following activities:

- Setting and reviewing goals
- CV and cover letter writing
- Job searching and preparation of applications
- Interview practice
- · Searching for education, training, etc
- University applications
- Funding applications

#### English and IT classes (group and one-to-one)


Our education programme provides tailored English language support and IT training courses to increase client's confidence and prepare them for the workplace. The following courses are currently being offered, on a rotational basis:


- Pre-beginner, Beginner, Intermediate and Advanced English
