Aims/priorities: Cash 4 Graft rewards resident involvement and volunteering time with between £50 and £250 to help get community ideas off the ground. The awards are matched with the passion and effort of residents and their neighbours who work together to create and develop projects and are available in various areas of Greater Manchester.



Who can apply: Forever Manchester support smaller organisations with a track record of attracting funding or a turnover under £150,000 per annum.

Grant amount: Awards between £50 and £250 are available

Forever Manchester is the local partner responsible for managing the money and Harpurhey and Moston is the beneficiary area for the funding. The programme will seek to

Aims/priorities: The Manchester Airport Community Trust Fund is a registered charity and was established to promote, enhance, improve and protect both the natural and built environment in our local community. To be successful a group must:

Who can apply: Community groups and charities that are approximately within a 10-mile radius of the Airport, concentrating on the areas most exposed to aircraft noise.

Neighbourhood Investment Funds

Aims/priorities: These are funds available to communities to make their neighbourhoods better places to live. £20,000 of neighbourhood investment funding is available to every area (ward) in Manchester each year - to help groups carry out events and activities that benefit people in their local neighbourhood.



Who can apply: The fund is open to established groups, voluntary groups and other community groups, as well as groups of residents working together for the first time. School Parent Teacher Associations can also apply if they have the support of local residents and parents and the project benefits the wider community as well as the school.

Grant amount: Applications should not exceed £10,000

Deadline: Ongoing, apply at any time

Granada Foundation



Aims/priorities: Grant for voluntary and community organisations undertaking projects that encourage involvement in and understanding of the fine arts and science in the North West of

England. The Foundation wishes to encourage and promote the study, practice and appreciation of the fine arts, including drawing, architecture and landscape architecture, sculpture, literature, music, opera, drama, cinema, and the methods and means of their dissemination.

The Foundation also welcomes applications which aim to engage and inspire young people and adults to take an interest in science. In general, the Council looks for imaginative proposals which will in some way make the north-west a richer and more attractive place in which to live and work. Preference is given to supporting new projects. Although the Foundation will support festivals and other annual events, it is on the understanding that such support should not be regarded as automatically renewable.

Who can apply: Organisations in the North West of England are eligible to apply. Preference will be given to organisations with charitable status.

Grant amount: No stated minimum or maximum amounts.

Application process: Applications are made via a two-stage application process:

- Applicants must first submit an enquiry form or call the Foundation for an informal discussion
- An application form will then be sent to organisations that the Foundation considers suitable to apply

CHILDREN & YOUNG PEOPLE

Cash for Kids - Greater Manchester

Aims/priorities: Cash for Kids exists for the sole purpose of helping children under the age of 18 years who are disabled or disadvantaged.

Cash for Kids is currently encouraging applications with projects:

- Targeting educational and academic attainments and employability
- Helping young people overcome social and educational barriers to enable them to reach their full potential
- Providing aspirational role models and activities to encourage children to meet their full potential
- From a wider range of sporting and culture activities as it receives a large number of applications from football and music activities



Who can apply: Funding can be provided to registered charities and formally constituted voluntary and community organisations based in Greater Manchester, Macclesfield and Warrington areas.

Favourable consideration will be given to those projects which directly benefit a number/large number of children and/or positively increase the quality of their lives.

Grant amount: The average grant value is approximately £2,500; however, support is also available for significantly larger grants.

Application process: Application forms are available to download from the website below. Grant applications must be accompanied by the most recently audited annual accounts of the organisation seeking the grant. Applications must be submitted by email; they can no longer be accepted by post.

Children in Need – Small and Main Grants

Aims/priorities: Supports organisations working with disadvantaged children and young people 18 years old and under. They may be disadvantaged due to:

1. Illness, distress, abuse or neglect



2. Any kind of disability
3. Behavioural or psychological difficulties
4. Living in poverty or situations of deprivation

Who can apply: Registered charities and not for profit organisations

Grant amount: Small: Up to £10,000 to be used in 12 months. Main: Unlikely to be more than £40,000 per year for a 3 year period

Jeans for Genes Day/Genetic Disorders UK Grant Programme

Aims/priorities: Jeans for Genes Day provide grants to disorder-specific charities and patient groups to fund projects and services for children affected by genetic disorders.

Who can apply: Grants are available for UK charities and support groups that support children (18 years or under) and families with genetic disorders.

Grant amount: Normally between £500 and £25,000

Who Can Apply: Not for profit and charities that will benefit the wider community.

Application process: Complete an eligibility checker if this fits the Foundations guidelines and criteria, contact your local store, depot or home office – Community Champion to see if this is something they would like to work on with you and support locally.

Applications are reviewed by the Asda Foundation team if additional information is required the Community Champion will be contacted.

Big Lottery Fund – Celebrate England

Aims/priorities: This Fund has been setup in response to a YouGov survey with over 2000 people where Six out of ten people said they cannot remember ever coming together to celebrate with their community.



The scheme will provide grants for one off events and activities which give their community the chance to come together to mark something important, such as the Queens 90th Birthday, commemorating a local historic event or getting to know the neighbours better.

Eligible projects will need to demonstrate that they are open to everyone in the local community.

Who can apply: Voluntary or community organisations, schools and statutory bodies

Grant Amount: Between £300 and £10,000

Application process: Application form available from the website

Deadline: Applications can be submitted at any time and are open on a 'first come, first served' basis until the funding is exhausted. £3.875million is available across all of England.

Greggs Foundation - Local Community Projects Fund

Aims/priorities: Funding is available for projects that improve resilience within a community of interest. This can include sessional activities/respite support, equipment for sessional activities, trips and residential breaks. The Foundation is also interested in new



approaches and innovative ideas as well as sustainable approaches to supporting the community of interest. All projects must support a community of interest, i.e. people who are:

- Disabled or suffering chronic illness
- Living in poverty
- Voluntary carers
- Homeless
- Isolated older people
- Other demonstrable significant need

Successful applicants should be able to demonstrate improvements against at least one of the Key Performance Targets to be successful for a grant:

- Beneficiaries have decreased social isolation
- Beneficiaries report improved health and wellbeing
- Beneficiaries report improved resilience/coping mechanisms
- Beneficiaries have improved life skills
- Beneficiaries have improved opportunities

They do not fund ongoing running costs or 'friends of' groups, uniformed groups or sports clubs and associations.

Who can apply: Not for profit organisations are eligible to apply. Priority will be given to organisations that have Greggs shops or premises nearby. The Foundation is unlikely to consider requests from larger organisations with an income greater than £300,000 or organisations with more than six months running costs in a cash reserve.

Grant amount: £2,000

Application Process: Application forms are available to complete online at the Foundation's website.

Deadlines: 30 September 2016, however, the Foundation is highly over-subscribed and reserves the right to close the application window if it has received more applications than it is able to fund.

The Bernard Sunley Charitable Foundation

Priorities/details: The trustees support capital projects only, not running costs. There is a

preference to support projects related to the fabric of a building, though equipment and transport may be considered.

Applications for new build, refurbishment of or improvements to village halls, scout huts, youth clubs, community centres etc will be considered. This often includes access for the disabled, modernising kitchens, new storage space and updating toilets in line with Health and Safety regulations and the Disability Discrimination Act.

Also capital projects for special schools, residential care housing, treatment centres (Including the provision of equipment to enhance medical treatment and care), residential facilities for the homeless and drop in or rehabilitation centres for people with mental health difficulties or addictions.

Who can apply: Registered charities

Grant amount: There are three types of grant: Small – up to and including £5,000; Medium – £5,001 to £25,000; Large – over £25,000. Small grants account for 80% of those awarded annually. Applications are expected to be for not more than 50% of the whole project budget.

Application process: Online application form which must be completed in one sitting.

Power to Change – Community Business Fund

Aims/priorities: The Community Business Fund will provide successful organisations with funding towards:

- Capital costs including building, vehicles, equipment of significant value, refurbishment costs. For building projects, you will either need to own or be taking on ownership of the building or have a long lease in proportion to the amount of grant you are requesting.
- Project-specific revenue costs like staff costs, professional fees, volunteer costs. We are unlikely to fund projects which are asking only to cover the cost of staff salaries unless you are able to clearly demonstrate how this will help your organisation transform its trading position to allow you to become more financially viable in the long term.

Power to Change will fund up to 75% of revenue costs, up to 75% of the building-related capital costs and 100% of other capital costs.



Who can apply: Grants are available to help locally rooted and accountable community businesses in England that have been trading for the benefit of the local community for more than 1 year.

Grant amount: between £50,000 and £300,000

Application process: Online application form

Deadline: Applications will open on 27 July and will be accepted until 31 August, with grants being taken forwarded within 6 months of submission

Rank Foundation - 'Pebbles' Small Grants Programme

Aims/priorities: Funds particular projects with an overall cost of less than £1m where the main element is capital costs (building work, refurbishment or the purchase of long-term equipment) or a one-off short term activity (such as an annual respite break or holiday for disadvantaged young people.) Applicants must have already raised a third of the total costs. They do not fund ongoing running costs.



Who can apply: Registered charities and churches for projects that benefit UK residents in UK communities

Aims/priorities: Grants are available for practical projects or initiatives which will:

- Focus on the health needs of unpaid carers, rather than on those they care for
- Support adult carers aged over 25 years and above
- Address the day to day needs of carers
- Engage and support unpaid carers directly

HEALTH & WELLBEING

Coalfields Community Investment Programme (England)

Aims/priorities: The Coalfields Regeneration Trust is dedicated to improving the quality of life for the 5.5 million people living in Britain's former mining communities.

The fund is currently open to projects that will increase participation in activities/services that improve the health and wellbeing of people in the top 30% most deprived of



former coalfield communities. This may include sports projects focusing on the stated underrepresented groups (Impairment Groups/Disabled People, Women and girls, Victims of abuse, Carers, Homeless people), healthy eating initiatives, mental health support and projects focusing on promoting social interaction and engagement.

Who Can Apply: Not for profit community organisations whose unrestricted income is less than £250,000

Grant amount: Applications can be submitted for up to £10,000 (with a maximum of £2,000 on capital items)

Application process: Read the online eligibility form and complete the survey link at the end. An application form will be emailed in 7 days to eligible organisations

Will Charitable Trust

Aims/priorities: Grants are available for the care of and services for people suffering from cancer, and their families. Trustees prefer to support new or capital projects, not running costs.

Who Can Apply: Registered or exempt charities of all sizes are eligible to apply. Applicant organisations must have proven track records of successful work in their field of operation or, in the case of newer charities, convincing evidence of ability.

Grant amount: Generally fall within the range of £5,000 to £20,000

SPORT & RECREATION

Sport England - Small Grant Scheme

Aims/priorities: The Sport England Small Grants Programme has been set up to support local community sport projects which seek to increase participation, sustain participation or develop opportunities



for people aged 14+ to excel at their chosen sport. Projects must meet at least one of the following criteria:

- An increase in the proportion of 14-25's playing sport once a week
- A growth in regular (once a week) participation for all those aged 14+
- A reduction in drop off at ages 16, 18, 21 & 24
- Growth in participation by people (aged 14+) with a disability

Who can apply: It is open to any bona fide not-for-profit club or association, statutory body or educational establishment. The total project costs must not exceed £50,000

Grant amount: Grants of between £300 and £10,000 are available for project costs

Application process: Complete an eligibility self-checklist first. If you are eligible, apply via a single-stage online form. Bids should be submitted 3 months before projects are due to start.

Sport England – Get Equipped Fund

Aims/priorities: Sport England know that many organisations and clubs delivering sport struggle to provide sporting opportunities for disabled people because of a lack of access to specialist



equipment. To address this, the Get Equipped fund will invest £1 million of National Lottery funding into the provision of specialist equipment to deliver sport to disabled people. The majority of funded projects will be using the equipment to encourage people aged 14+ to take part.

Who can apply: Get Equipped can fund formally constituted not-for-profit organisations and statutory bodies. This might include sports clubs, voluntary organisations, local authorities, schools or governing bodies of sport

- Innovation
- Management
- Partnership
- Achievement
- Community focus
- Targeting needs
