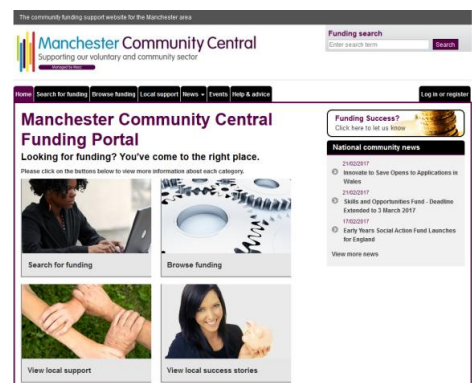

By becoming a member of Macc you will gain access to our free funding portal of funding



opportunities. Please note: To be eligible to access our funding portal you must be a VCSE organisation working in the City of Manchester with at least 50% of your beneficiaries in the City of Manchester. VCSE organisations working outside of the City of Manchester, consultants, sole traders, statutory bodies, private businesses and infrastructure organisations who become members of Macc aren't eligible to access our funding portal. <b>The Charity Service – Cinderella Charitable Fund</b>		
<b>Aims/priorities:</b>	The Cinderella Fund can be used by groups or individuals to support the cost of a short respite holiday, day trip or activity for disabled, sick, convalescent or disadvantaged children whose family are unable to afford the cost. Grants are available to residents who live within the geographical areas of Greater Manchester, East Lancashire, North East Cheshire and North West Derbyshire.	
<b>Who can apply?</b>	Individuals or groups/organisations within the Greater Manchester area. Individual applications must be supported by a Charitable Organisation or a sponsor such as a Social Worker, GP or other professional person who live in the UK (and hold a British or Irish passport). The organisation or sponsor should complete the application on behalf of the individual.	
<b>Grant amount:</b>	The average grant award is £1,000	
<b>Application process:</b>	There is an online application form	
<b>Deadline:</b>	Applications up to £1,000 14 February 2022

<b>Who can apply?</b>	Any companies and organisations, including community groups and charities, that are based in Cheshire, Greater Manchester, Staffordshire, Merseyside, Flintshire, Wrexham and Lancashire. To be eligible, applicants must: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Have a bank or building society account</li> <li>• Be able to use the grant within four months of receiving it</li> <li>• Be willing to take part in any media or press activities that may take place</li> <li>• Have their registered office address or place of business in the North West of England</li> </ul>

<p><b>Aims/priorities:</b></p>	<p>Virgin Money Foundation are on a mission to support community regeneration by backing people who can make big changes happen locally. ### Let's Create Jubilee Fund


<b>Aims/priorities:</b>	The Let's Create Jubilee Fund encourages voluntary and community groups to partner with established artists, creatives and cultural organisations to develop community activities which celebrate the Queen's Jubilee. Funded projects can't start before the 1st April and must culminate in creative and cultural activity for the community which takes place in June. Applicants are strongly encouraged to partner with local professional artists.
<b>Who can apply?</b>	The Let's Create Jubilee Fund is open to voluntary and community organisations with charitable aims and working towards a common goal which does not have to be based solely around arts and culture. This could include youth groups, parent/carer groups and volunteer organisations. Applicants must be based in one of the ten boroughs of Greater Manchester and have been formally established for at least 12 months at the time of submitting an application. They should also be able to show they have experience of managing projects of a similar scale to the one they are applying for.
<b>Grant amount:</b>	The minimum award request that will be considered is £750 and the maximum is £10,000

<b>Aims/priorities:</b>	<p>The Manchester Airport Community Trust Fund is a registered charity and was established to promote, enhance, improve and protect both the natural and built environment in the local community. To be successful a group must:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Carry out positive work in the community and be of charitable nature and be not for profit status</li> <li>• Be community, socially or environmentally focused</li> <li>• Based within the area of benefit</li> </ul> <p>The project should offer / be:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Improve, enhance, protect and conserve the natural and built environment; or offer heritage conservation</li> <li>• Promote or advance social welfare</li> <li>• Provide better appreciation of the natural and urban environment</li> <li>• Create a safe habitat for flora and fauna</li> <li>• Demonstrate lasting benefit to the community</li> <li>• Benefit all members of the community regardless of race, gender or religion</li> <li>• Be from an established group or charity able to demonstrate clear banking or financial records, and not an individual or commercial organisation working for profit</li> </ul>	
<b>Who can apply?</b>	Community groups and charities that are approximately within a 10-mile radius of the Airport, concentrating on the areas most exposed to aircraft noise

<b>Aims/priorities:</b>	A budget of £1.5m has been allocated for the three-year Manchester Wellbeing Fund, for community groups and GMMH service users who have great ideas about how to support their communities. The main objectives of the Fund are: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• To develop community support around people's mental health needs</li> <li>• To promote mental health and wellbeing</li> <li>• To challenge the stigma around mental illness</li> </ul>
<b>Who can apply?</b>	The Fund is for groups and service users who are passionate about mental wellbeing in their communities. It is designed to support individual projects rather than provide core funding for organisations.
<b>Grant amount:</b>	Grants of between £250 – £3,000 are available
<b>Application process:</b>	Applicants need to first complete an online expression of interest form. For grants of up to £500 applicants will only have to submit an expression of interest form.

<b>Neighbourhood Investment Funds</b>		 <b>MANCHESTER CITY COUNCIL</b>
<b>Aims/priorities:</b>	Neighbourhood Investment Funds are available to communities to make their neighbourhoods better places to live. £20,000 of neighbourhood investment funding is available to every area (ward) in Manchester each year – to help groups carry out events and activities that benefit people in their local neighbourhood.	
<b>Who can apply?</b>	The fund is open to established groups, voluntary groups and other community groups, as well as groups of residents working together for the first time. School Parent Teacher Associations can also apply if they have the support of local residents and parents and the project benefits the wider community as well as the school.	
<b>Grant amount:</b>	Applications should not exceed £10,000

<b>Parks improvements funding</b>		 <b>MANCHESTER CITY COUNCIL</b>
<b>Aims/priorities:</b>	Manchester City Council want to hear from local groups and organisations with ideas to use this funding to build upon, add to, or improve park assets. Applications for the Parks In Partnership funding must show how they support at least one of these four themes: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Parks at the heart of neighbourhoods</li> <li>• Vibrant parks, vibrant communities</li> <li>• A Manchester quality standard</li> <li>• Productive partnerships in parks</li> </ul>	
<b>Who can apply?</b>	Applications can be submitted by local community and voluntary groups, Friends of groups, current parks operators, charities and companies (registered companies or charities that apply will need to provide at least two years financial accounts.)	
<b>Grant amount:</b>	The £12.5m will be split between: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Parks in Partnership will invest £960,000 directly into local parks via local groups and organisations, with each Manchester ward receiving £30,000 for capital projects that raise standards (one year funding)</li> <li>• Parks Development Programme will support larger capital projects from £30,000 up to £2.5m (four year programme.) Working with external bodies and partners to secure match funding for major works will maximise the impact of this programme.</li> </ul>

<b>Who can apply?</b>	Applications will be accepted from registered charities that are led by and for members of specific Black, Asian or Minority Ethnic communities (more than half the Trustee Board must self-identify as belonging to a Black, Asian or Minority Ethnic community).
