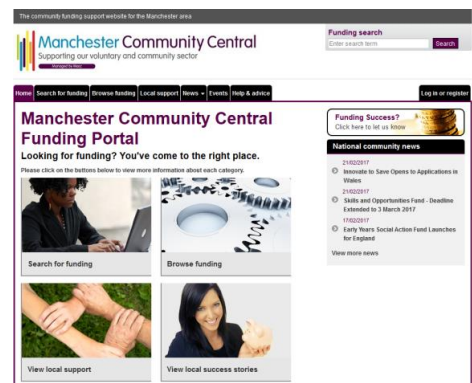

funding portal you must be a VCSE organisation working in the City of Manchester with at least 50% of your beneficiaries in the City of Manchester. VCSE organisations working outside of the City of Manchester, consultants, sole traders, statutory bodies, private businesses and infrastructure organisations who become members of Macc aren't eligible to access our funding portal. To be eligible, applicants must:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Have a bank or building society account</li> <li>• Be able to use the grant within four months of receiving it</li> <li>• Be willing to take part in any media or press activities that may take place</li> <li>• Have their registered office address or place of business in the North West of England</li> </ul>

<b>Application process:</b>	<p>An application form can be downloaded from the website</p>

<b>Aims/priorities:</b>	<p>A budget of £1.5m has been allocated for the three-year Manchester Wellbeing Fund, for community groups and GMMH service users who have great ideas about how to support their communities. The main objectives of the Fund are:</p>	



	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• To develop community support around people's mental health needs</li> <li>• To promote mental health and wellbeing</li> <li>• To challenge the stigma around mental illness</li> </ul>
<b>Who can apply?</b>	The Fund is for groups and service users who are passionate about mental wellbeing in their communities. It is designed to support individual projects rather than provide core funding for organisations.
<b>Grant amount:</b>	Grants of between £250 – £3,000 are available

<b>Neighbourhood Investment Funds</b>		 <b>MANCHESTER CITY COUNCIL</b>
<b>Aims/priorities:</b>	Neighbourhood Investment Funds are available to communities to make their neighbourhoods better places to live. £20,000 of neighbourhood investment funding is available to every area (ward) in Manchester each year – to help groups carry out events and activities that benefit people in their local neighbourhood.	
<b>Who can apply?</b>	The fund is open to established groups, voluntary groups and other community groups, as well as groups of residents working together for the first time. School Parent Teacher Associations can also apply if they have the support of local residents and parents and the project benefits the wider community as well as the school.	
<b>Grant amount:</b>	Applications should not exceed £10,000	
<b>Application process:</b>	There is an online application form	
<b>Deadline:</b>	Applications can be submitted at any time

<b>Parks improvements funding</b>		 <b>MANCHESTER CITY COUNCIL</b>
<b>Aims/priorities:</b>	Manchester City Council want to hear from local groups and organisations with ideas to use this funding to build upon, add to, or improve park assets. Applications for the Parks In Partnership funding must show how they support at least one of these four themes: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Parks at the heart of neighbourhoods</li> <li>• Vibrant parks, vibrant communities</li> <li>• A Manchester quality standard</li> <li>• Productive partnerships in parks</li> </ul>	
<b>Who can apply?</b>	Applications can be submitted by local community and voluntary groups, Friends of groups, current parks operators, charities and companies (registered companies or charities that apply will need to provide at least two years financial accounts.)	
<b>Grant amount:</b>	The £12.5m will be split between: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Parks in Partnership will invest £960,000 directly into local parks via local groups and organisations, with each Manchester ward receiving £30,000 for capital projects that raise standards (one year funding)</li> <li>• Parks Development Programme will support larger capital projects from £30,000 up to £2.5m (four year programme.) Working with external bodies and partners to secure match funding for major works will maximise the impact of this programme.</li> </ul>

<b>Paul Hamlyn Foundation – Arts Access and Participation Fund</b>	
<b>Aims/priorities:</b>	<p>As one of the largest independent grant-making foundations in the UK, the Foundation partners with inspiring organisations and individuals to make sure that people facing disadvantage are at the heart of leading change and designing solutions to overcome inequality. The new UK strategy identifies five strategic priorities relating to changes the PHF wishes to see in the UK. These are:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Investing in young people</li> <li>• Migration and integration</li> <li>• Arts access and participation</li> <li>• Education and learning through the arts</li> <li>• Nurturing ideas and people</li> </ul>
<b>Who can apply?</b>	Not-for-profit, formally constituted organisations in the UK are eligible to apply
<b>Grant amount:</b>	<p>Grants of between £30,000 and £400,000 for activity lasting between 12 months and 4 years with an option to extend for a further period. Most grants are in the £60,000 to £250,000 range.</p> <p>Pre-application access support and a bursary of up to £500 is available to help groups apply.</p>
<b>Application process:</b>	There is a two-stage online application process. The Foundation aims to reach a final decision on applications within four months of receipt of stage 1 applications.

<b>Who can apply?</b>	Applications will be accepted from registered charities that are led by and for members of specific Black, Asian or Minority Ethnic communities (more than half the Trustee Board must self-identify as belonging to a Black, Asian or Minority Ethnic community).
<b>Grant amount:</b>	<p>Successful applicants will receive:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Two-year unrestricted grants of £50,000</li> <li>• Support from the Foundation’s regional managers who will work with them to access a wide range of organisational development support to help meet identified needs</li> </ul>
<b>Application process:</b>	The first step in the application process is to read the eligibility criteria and then complete the short eligibility checker, on the website

<b>Buttle UK – Chances for Children</b>	
<b>Aims/priorities:</b>	The Chances for Children grants scheme aims to improve the social and emotional wellbeing of children and young people and their capacity to engage in education and learning.
<b>Who can apply?</b>	Applications are only accepted from frontline professionals working closely with the children/young person, who have carried out at least one home visit, and made a full assessment of the children’s/young person’s needs. The professional will also need to supervise grant spend, upload receipts and

	<p>complete an evaluation survey. Children/young people must meet ALL of the following:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Be a child or young person aged 18 and under if living with parent/carer, OR 20 and under if living independently with little or no support from their family</li> <li>• Be living on a low income and experiencing financial hardship</li> <li>• Have experienced a crisis that has recently had a significant and enduring impact on their social wellbeing, their emotional wellbeing and their educational engagement</li> <li>• The family/young person must have recently taken action to improve their situation, are actively engaging with support and are moving on from the crisis</li> </ul>
<b>Grant amount:</b>	Grants of up to £2,000
<b>Application process:</b>	There is an online application form
<b>Deadline:</b>	Applications can be submitted at any time

Priority will be given to projects that will benefit disadvantaged and disabled children in the most deprived areas in the UK. This means areas that fall within the bottom 20% according to the National Indices of Deprivation. For groups of children with disabilities, more flexibility will be given regarding the level of deprivation.
<b>Grant amount:</b>	One-off grants of between £500 and £2,500 are available.
<b>Application process:</b>	There is an online application form
<b>Deadline:</b>	Deadline: 30 April, for trips taking place 4 April to 30 June 2022. Grants are made on a first come, first served basis until the available funding for that round has been fully allocated. All applications should be received at least six weeks before the date of the trip to allow for administrative processing and decision making.

<b>Aims/priorities:</b>	The Masonic Charitable Foundation (MCF) offers grants to local and national charities in England and Wales as part of its work to help thousands of disadvantaged and vulnerable people to live happy, fulfilling lives and participate actively in society. Over the last 40 years, the MCF has provided more than £130 million to charities. The MCF's work is funded solely through the donations of Freemasons under the United Grand Lodge of England, their families and friends. Based on conducted surveys which indicate which areas Freemason care most about, the MCF has set out new target areas for its grant-making programme:
