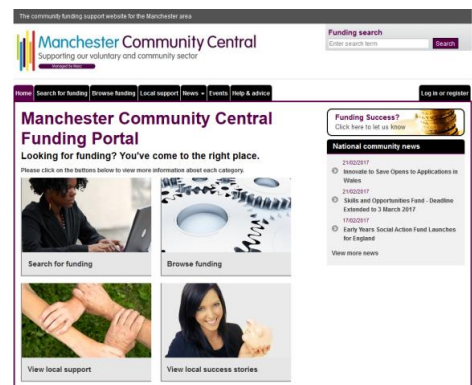

VCSE organisations working outside of the City of Manchester, consultants, sole traders, statutory bodies, private businesses and infrastructure organisations who become members of Macc aren't eligible to access our funding portal. Aims/priorities:	The Paul Hamlyn Foundation’s (PHF's) mission is to “help people overcome disadvantage and lack of opportunity, so that they can realise their potential and enjoy fulfilling and creative lives”. The Foundation places particular focus on supporting both young people and the arts. Henry Smith Charity – Holiday Grants for Children		
Aims/priorities:	<p>In 2021, given the impact of coronavirus/Covid-19, the Charity has made some temporary changes to its guidelines to provide more flexibility on the types of trip it can support and is now funding day trips rather than residential holidays, with the aim of maximising the likelihood of trips going ahead. Applications can be made for grants towards a single or multiple day trips. Examples include theme parks, trips to adventure activity centres, the seaside, cultural centres such as museums, theatre performances or a sporting event. Eligible day trips should not involve a disproportionate amount of time spent travelling. Grants are only available to support children who are aged 13 and under.
