Greater Manchester has become a Fast-Track City; a global partnership between cities that have the ambition of ending all new cases of HIV within a generation by reducing transmissions, late HIV diagnoses, and eventually new diagnoses of HIV.

GM HIV Testing Week '23 is a chance to encourage all Greater Manchester residents to know their status.

It's a great opportunity to get tested and encourage others to test for HIV.

We want to encourage people to test through focusing on how easy it is to do a self-sampling test in the comfort of their own home. We also want to empower people to know what to do if the test does come back positive.

HIV: Let's sort this together.



Key definitions

HIV: HIV stands for Human Immunodeficiency Virus. Once in the body, and left untreated, the virus weakens the immune system by attacking the cells that help the body fight off infections and diseases.

PrEP: PrEP stands for pre-exposure prophylaxis. It is a prevention medication for those who don't have HIV but are at risk of contracting it, to reduce the risk of them getting HIV if they are exposed to the virus.

PEP: PEP stands for post-exposure prophylaxis. Similarly to PrEP, PEP reduces the risk of contracting HIV, however PEP is a medication taken after potential exposure to the virus rather than before. PEP is a 30-day course of medication that is available through A&E and GUM clinics.

U=U: U=U stands for undetectable = untransmittable. It refers to the fact that through a combination of medications known as antiretroviral therapy (ART), people with HIV can become 'untransmittable'. This means that there is a low count of the HIV virus in their blood meaning that they have a low viral load. Once the viral load is low enough then the likelihood of that person passing on HIV is almost zero.
