We work with a wide range of social, emotional, and behavioural difficulties, including:

Depression * Anxiety * Attachment difficulties * Relationship problems * Domestic violence * Sexual abuse * School problems * Developmental delay * Racial and ethnic identity development * Trauma * Bereavement * Behavioural problems * Work with looked after children and safeguarding issues *Racial and ethnic identity development* Gender identity *Neurodiversity.

We also deliver court-instructed interventions with children and adults. Therapeutic approaches on offer include:

- * Parenting interventions delivered individually, drawing on a range of evidence-based parenting programmes (e.g., Trauma-informed therapeutic parenting, the Solihull approach, Attachment -focussed parenting/ family interventions, Dyadic Developmental Psychotherapy (DDP), Video interaction guidance (VIG)).
- * Individual and Family Interventions including family and systemic therapy approaches, parent-infant therapy, art therapy, cognitive behavioural therapy (CBT), EMDR, Children's Accelerated Trauma Treatment (CATT), Narrative Exposure Therapy (NET) and psychodynamic approaches.

Who is Eligible?

- * A child, family, or adult who identifies as Black, Asian or from a minority ethnic group, including Looked after Children. This can include a larger family group where just one child or adult identifies as such;
- * No upper age limit;
- * The client is interested in working on their concerns with a psychological therapist.

Please note, referrals of people with:

- a primary drug problem
- a primary alcohol problem
- persistent self-harming or suicidality
- a history of violence
