

# Universal Credit - Support for Manchester Residents

## Extra Support

- Jobcentre Work Coaches can support residents with their initial claim and help them access wider support. Once an online claim has been made they will be requested to phone and make an appointment with their Work Coach.
- If a resident is not going to be able to make or manage their claim via the online portal, they or their representative should speak to the DWP UC Service Centre on 0800 328 9344, or visit a Jobcentre, to discuss options
- If someone is struggling with the initial wait for their first payment, they should arrange an appointment with the Shelter budgeting support service and they can also apply for an Advanced Payment (loan) from their Jobcentre Work Coach
- For colleagues working with Care Leavers a process is in place to support those moving on to UC. The claim can be made as they approach their 18th birthday. Each Jobcentre has a Single Point of Contact to support care leavers.
- Please encourage any UC claimant in a vulnerable situation to speak to their Jobcentre Work Coach. Support workers, family and friends can act as advocates and attend meetings with them.
- For support workers who need information to assist someone with their claim, UC claimants are able to obtain information about their claim and status by logging into their online journal
- If there are concerns about a claimant's situation or ability to manage their UC budget, and they've had support from Shelter, an Alternative Payment Arrangement (e.g. direct rent payment to the landlord) can be discussed with the Jobcentre Work Coach
