

Volunteer Mentor opportunities

Nurse. Construction Worker. Accountant. Mum. Business owner. Farmer. Dentist. Student - just some of the lives people led before they were forced to flee their home countries and become refugees. Lives defined by work, education or family.

If you live in Manchester, Salford or nearby and have lots of UK work experience - in any sector - you can apply to be a volunteer mentor to make a difference to refugees' employment prospects.

In Greater Manchester unemployment is 6.6%* compared to around 44%* for refugees.

Mentors provide one-to-one support for three to nine months. Together you will identify short and long term goals, use an action plan to identify steps to get work experience and/or a job, and build a professional, trusting relationship. It will include direct help, such as practising English or interview skills, alongside enabling people to access other services and opportunities.

What you will gain

- Mentoring experience and skills working to recognised national quality standards.
- Be part of a dynamic new organisation making a difference to reduce unemployment.
- Insight into refugee experiences in the UK.

Support you will get

- Regular one-to-one and group support.
- Induction and training.

Commitment from you

- At least five hours mentoring support a month, ideally meeting at least twice.
- Information session Thursday 19 January, 5.30-7.30pm *or* Saturday 21 January, 10-12pm.
- Induction Saturday 11 February, half day.
- Mentor training Two half days, on Saturday 18 February and in March, to be arranged. If you are interested but think you may face difficulties attending these dates please do contact us.
