Guidance Notes and Application Template





One Manchester is currently inviting applications to our Social Recovery Fund.

We are seeking to offer grants of between £2,000 and £10,000 that will rebuild and grow new connections in our communities.

We are looking to hear from organisations in our neighbourhoods that will ensure noone lacks the opportunities to socialise and develop inclusive peer support networks. Put simply, we want to help isolated people in our communities to make lasting friendships and socialise in their neighbourhoods, to get them the help they need when they need it.

We know that the pandemic has taken its toll in our communities. Aside from the impact on health and the economy, social distancing and isolation has meant that many of us have lost people close to us, and not had the opportunity to develop and maintain the connections with our friends and neighbours.

We know there has been a decline in mental well-being in recent months and there has been an increase in the number of people reporting that they feel lonely. We also know that the people of Manchester are not going to accept that and have the creativity and willingness to step up and support each other.

We want to make it easier for people in our communities that have challenges making positive social connections. We want our funding to support people in the coming months, but also have a lasting impact.

We are particularly interested in projects that engage with individuals and communities that are at a greater risk of being isolated or lonely, and may not be engaging with other support available. This may for example include people with health conditions and disabilities, people who live alone, older people who lost contact with friends and family, people who are new to our city, or in transition and need support to settle.

The fund will be open for applications from Friday 24th September, and close at Midnight on Sunday 31st October.



Who can apply

Voluntary, Community and Social Enterprise (VCSE) organisations that are Manchester based, predominantly serving residents in the Manchester Neighbourhoods listed below. Projects in all areas are eligible, but we will weight applications from the areas with asterisks, which have been under-represented in our previous rounds of COVID response grants. We want to make sure that our tenants will benefit from the services provided. However, projects can also benefit the wider community in these areas.

To meet our eligibility requirements, the lead applicant organisations will need to be able to provide:

- A current copy of a suitable governing document for a not-for-profit voluntary organisation, charity, or social enterprise.
- Proof of a bank account in the name of the organisation.
- Proof of identify of applicant, and their connection to the organisation applying.
- This fund will not accept applications from individuals.

Partnership applications are welcome, although the lead applicant will be accountable for funding and delivery and must meet the above requirements.

What will we fund

We want to target funding at enabling projects that will have the greatest reach and impact within our target areas. We want to support people that are at a greater risk of being isolated or lonely and may not be engaging with other support available. This may for example include:

people with health conditions and disabilities



- people who live alone
- older people who lack friends and family
- people who are new to our city or in transition and need support to settle.

Examples of what we can fund include:

- Items of equipment, materials or goods
- Costs for community events or engagements
- Publicity materials and costs of taking part in events
- Volunteer expenses and training for volunteers
- Costs of interpretations, translations, and alternative formats or other interventions to make your support inclusive
- Costs towards sessional work, or contributions towards salaries
- Travel costs

Projects will have up to 12 months to complete the project and spend grants awarded in line with their proposal.

Aims and Objectives

We want to understand who your project will support, and what difference it will make. Successful projects will be required to monitor and report back on what's been achieved. Outcomes will be agreed depending on the nature of the projects, but may include:

- Numbers of people engaging in social / community activity for the first time
- Demographic information about people engaged in support or activities, such as age, gender, ethnicity, disability status and postcode
- How often people are engaging with the project activities
- The difference that the project is making to the individuals involved, such as reducing loneliness, creating new friendships, or increasing happiness.

We will prioritise proposals that:

 Demonstrate a good awareness and understanding of the individuals and groups they will target.



- Target support to individuals most at risk of loneliness and isolation.
- Fill gaps in existing support provision.
- Can provide evidence, or clearly explain how the project will be successful in overcoming barriers to engagement.
- Will have a lasting impact beyond the 12 months of funding.


